You are cordially invited to the fourth STOP Stakeholder Dialogue, organised as part of the STOP project, which will take place **virtually** on **Tuesday 22 March 2022**.

The STOP stakeholder dialogues aim to provide a space for discussion to learn from individuals from different backgrounds and sectors who are actively involved in addressing childhood obesity and to recommend to national authorities and the European Commission a sustainability plan for future stakeholder engagement on childhood obesity. Identifying and understanding the views and positions of a wide range of stakeholders will be vital for developing successful recommendations.

Thanks to your contributions to date, we have collected new knowledge and insights which will be integrated into the sustainability plan and recommendations for further stakeholder engagement in the EU.
