Why do we need a human rights-based approach?



From...

A medical approach which usually entails binary categorical approaches to diagnosis and individual-level processes.

This approach only **palliates** the damages of unjust social conditions.

...To

A biopsychosocial approach which keeps in mind the protection of human rights.


This approach understands psychological wellbeing depends on political, social and economic circumstances.



Structural discrimination

Antigypsyism is a historically constructed racism against Romani people. It includes homogenizing, attribution of specific traits and violent practices that reproduce violate structures.

Exclusion from social spheres

Rejection and lack of participation from political, economical and social fields (such as the access to basic rights and freedoms like employment, health, education or housing or participation in politics).

Transmitted trauma and interiorized discrimination

Social trauma, such as systemic racism, violent conflict and displacement, can damage communities for generations.

Romani Mental Wellbeing: A definition



Critical awareness and strengths


This is understood as a first step in the journey toward becoming a politically active member of society and a way to re-narrate our life stories to understand the unjust sources and our role in changing it.

Build networks and capacity to respond

Identifying support and allies in the community—organizations, local public officials, informal groups, community leaders, religious groups. This involves community organizing strategies, for example, building relationships and local coalitions.

Transformative multilevel changes

Taking action in different settings from the interpersonal level, organizational level, community level and institutional level.
